



LABOR REFORMS


- · Less 4 public holidays
- Vacation days: 3 extra days eliminated
- Overtime work payment reduced by 50%
- Layoff with new rules to reduce deadlines
- Hour bank system during production peaks
- Dismissal for inadequacy to work can now take place.
- No compensation for Dismissal with just cause
- Compensation for dismissal decreases


The country has made several efforts towards an increase in the foreign languages learning at school

- High Proficiency in English; Portugal ranks # 17 out of 60 countries according to EF English Proficiency Index 2013
- 80% of the students enrolled in high school also learn English;

- Around 20% of highly qualified workforce has attended foreign language degrees;






Eurostat, Labor cost per hour in euros, 2013


